



# More Tips & Activities to motivate your young author!



## Send Mrs. Arsenault an Email

Have your child type and send an email to me! I will respond too 😊!



## Mail me a letter in the US mail (snail mail)

Send me a letter in the mail and I will write back 😊

Or Send a letter to a Grandparent!



## Read me your writing on the phone!

They can call me on my school phone and read it to me!

*(If I am not there they can leave a message.)*



## Write a song

Write a song to teach to the class or to your family.



## Make a book for someone

Share your talents! Make a book for a friend or family member. Put that person's name in the book.



## Magazine Cutouts

Find a fun picture in a magazine and label it. You can also write a funny speech bubble that tells what you think he/she is saying.



## Photo Album

Make a photo album and write what is happening in each photo.



## Write on the windows!

Crayola has markers that can be used on windows. They are great!



## Talk about your stories!

Oral Language is very important! Tell stories and identify the beginning, middle and end. Work together to improve the story with important details.

## **Draw a story with a beginning/middle/end**

Draw a story with three parts. After drawing the 3 pictures, your child can label them or write sentences under them.

## **Retell a familiar or favorite story**

Have your child RETELL a favorite story that they know well. This will reduce the stress of thinking of what to write. Have them retell it in their own words.

## **Write with your child**



Have your child tell you a story and YOU write the words. They love doing this activity! Modeling writing is a great way to motivate your child ~ because they want to be just like you 😊!

## **Grocery List**



Have your write 5 things that you need to get from the grocery store. Then, let them be responsible for getting those items at the grocery store.

Remember – Writing is fun – These activities are supposed to be FUN and LOW STRESS! Let your child choose an activity or cut up the writing choices and let them pick out of a magic writing jar.
